*This course is designed for those who have a basic knowledge of French and would like to build on previous learning experiences to improve their level of proficiency. The four skills - listening, speaking, reading and writing - are developed in a relaxed, friendly and non-threatening environment. As the courses are small, students have many opportunities and are encouraged to participate to the maximum of their abilities. Basic French grammar is reviewed as needed and is adapted to meet the individual needs of the group. New grammar points are taught as part of the articles, surveys, advertisements and themes studied. These are very useful refresher courses for all those who wish to improve their communication skills in French as well as for those who are reaching this level for the first time. These courses are given in French.*
